

Planning for the Future

Over the course of the year, FOB staff and board members worked through a strategic planning process allowing us to reflect on our work and begin to make plans for the future. New mission, vision, and goals were adopted and strategies, tactics, and measurables were also developed. Our new mission is to empower families in Honduras through healthcare and education. We envision a strengthened Honduran healthcare system, where all have access to quality care.



Rotary International Global Grant

Through a three-year \$136,000 Rotary International Global Grant, FOB's Neonatal Intensive Care Unit (NICU) training project and certification course will become a sustainable educational opportunity for those caring for neonates in Honduras. In partnership with the Rotary Club of Merendón in San Pedro Sula, Honduras and the Rotary Club of Farmville in Virginia, USA, the grant will allow for the training of instructors in Honduras, who will then continue teaching the curriculum in other hospitals throughout Honduras. In addition to the training sessions, the grant will provide funds for the purchase of much needed equipment, teaching materials, and follow-up support.

Reaching Optimum Weight

Annually, FOB's Extended Care Program (ECP) provides services to 250+ children, who face extensive medical challenges. An important part of the program is a nutrition-oriented education, which includes monthly information sent through WhatsApp, a nutrition coloring book, and one on one consultations. Additional food items such as lentils and milk products are also provided when needed. We are pleased to report that in 2022, the number of ECP patients below their optimal weight was 17%, down from 27% in 2021. We are excited that our efforts in this area have improved the health of our patients!

Mountain Medical Teams Return

After nearly two years without teams on the ground, FOB's Mountain Medical Teams (MMTs) returned to Honduras. A schedule of ten MMTs served FOB's 30 partner communities, providing general medical, dental, and vision care services as well as fluoride, vitamins, and referral services. What a joy it is to have our teams on the ground and services being delivered to those with limited to no access to medical care.

Introducing Well Bags

Children and families in our 30 partner communities have little to no access to medications that many of us simply find in our home medicine cabinets or at the local drugstore. To empower our community members to take an active role in their own healthcare, FOB has begun to distribute FOB Well Bags in our partner communities. Well bags contain our most dispensed medications that will allow a family to treat a variety of common pains, cuts and scrapes, bug bites, and rashes as well as gastrointestinal issues.





COVID Vaccine Delivery & Education

In order to increase access to COVID vaccines in FOB's partner communities, we worked jointly with the Honduran Ministry of Health to transport their staff into areas with much need for vaccinations, but which were difficult to reach. Our FOB nurse educators also visited our partner communities to provide education on COVID prevention.
